National Plans of Action for Nutrition (NPANs) in Southeast Asia Countries

About the Webinar

The national plan of action for nutrition (NPAN) developed by a government has been recognised as a vital master plan in addressing nutritional issues of a particular country. The NPAN developed is more than a framework or a descriptive document. It serves as a tool for action, an operational plan that sets out strategies; identifies projects and activities, with details of implementation such as what, how and when; designates responsibilities and accountability for the activities; identifies resource requirements; and sets out the plan for monitoring and evaluation.

Countries in the Southeast Asia (SEA) region are facing similar burden of malnutrition, characterised by persistent undernutrition including stunting, wasting, micronutrients deficiencies and coexisting overweight and obesity across the life cycle. Many SEA countries have respectively developed their own NPAN to address these nutrition issues. The SEA-PHN Network has compiled and analysed the NPANs in six SEA countries (Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand & Vietnam) to share the approaches undertaken by the countries (https://doi.org/10.31246/mjn-review-26-3). This Webinar aims to share the available NPANs in SEA widely with all public health workers in the region, and provide a platform for an exchange of experiences in the development and implementation of NPANs in the six countries. Discussion and recommendations drawn from this webinar could serve as useful reference for the planning of nutrition policies and action plans in the future.

Webinar Objectives

- Share approaches, framework and experiences undertaken by SEA countries in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of NPAN.
- Discuss constraints and key success elements in each important stage of NPAN process (development, implementation, monitoring & evaluation)
- Discuss additional actions and supports required for successful implementation of NPAN
- Advocate periodic exchange of NPAN experiences among SEA countries, and explore potential for collaboration among SEA countries in NPAN development and review
